Formulations will draw on natural oils, extracts, and conditioning agents, and use food-grade, naturally-derived glycerin. Products will also be vegan, and contain no animal by-products, parabens, phthalates, mineral oil, urea, or petrol-derived ingredients.

Guests will soon be washing their hair with the Mint Thyme Hair Wash and following up with the Yuzu Bergamot Crème Rinse. Their bodies will be soaped up with Bamboo Lemongrass Body Wash, then moisturized with Lavender Lime Moisturizer. A gentle face soap and an exfoliating body soap will round out the Aromatherapy collection.

The packaging for the new line will also be in recyclable cartons printed with soy-based ink while the smaller tubes will include an organic additive called EcoPure. This will make the tubes and their caps biodegradable in a landfill as well recyclable.
